Information on the Covid 19 vaccination

Dear citizens of Schaffhausen

Please get vaccinated!

You will protect yourself and your family from a serious infection.

The Corona pandemic has spread widely in Switzerland and many people are getting infected and some of them fall seriously ill. Fortunately, there are vaccines that protect us from the disease. The vaccination requires two injections - four weeks apart. After that, you will be well protected, even from the dominant delta variant.

The vaccine is well tolerated by our body. Possible side effects (pain at the injection site, headache, fever) are usually mild and last for only a short period of time. These side effects are usually much less severe than when you actually get infected with corona. Serious long-term side effects and late effects have not occurred so far and are not to be expected.

We would like to finally overcome the pandemic and return to a normal life. In order to archieve this, we need the vaccination.

The vaccination is free of charge.

The vaccination certificate makes travelling abroad easier and guarantees access to various events.

We look forward to welcoming you to the Charlottenfels Vaccination Centre. It is very easy and uncomplicated to get the vaccination, either with or without previous registration.
